It also boosts socialising & forming positive relationships with others, provides an opportunity to express themselves and interact with other children. It also allows them to observe and find out about people, places, technology and the environment. While also enabling them to explore and play with a range of media and materials.

- We therefore must always get written consent from parents/carers to take photos/make videos of children at our setting. (Please refer to individual child registration form.)
- Only work phones/cameras can be used for this purpose.
- For Child Protection and Safeguarding reasons, certain children may not be allowed to have their photos taken and displayed, it is very important that neither staff nor children use the camera and video function on their phones to take photographs/make videos of children at Tarner Community Project in Tarner Community Project Park.(please refer to our Mobile phone policy)
- Visitors, parents or carers must not take photos of our setting without first speaking to the Manager (Kiki Virdee), the Assistant Manager (Mark Daniels) or the Trustees.
- Anyone seen to use their phone or camera to do this will be asked not to and an explanation as to why will be given. Equipment may be confiscated and put away in a safe and secure place until the matter is dealt with. (Please refer to our Mobile phone policy).
